The Williamson County Board of Commissioners met Tuesday, April 17, 2018 at 10:04 a.m. at the Williamson County Administrative Building Boardroom, Marion, Illinois, in a meeting of the Williamson County Board of Commissioners with the following members present:

Hearing was held for Club 262, for alleged violations:

1. Club 262 remained open with continued sales of alcoholic beverages to customers past the required 1:30 a.m. closing time.
2. Club 262 permitted a person under the age of 21 inside the establishment where alcoholic liquor was being sold.
3. Club 262 violated the Illinois Smoke Free Act, 410 ILCS 82/1 *et seq.*, in that they permitted smoking within the licensed establishment which is a public place.
4. Club 262 permitted acts of lewd behavior within the licensed establishment.
5. A complaint was filed against Club 262 for excessive noise and disorderly conduct.

Events of the evening/morning in question were conducted by Wendy Cunningham, Assistant State's Attorney, to both parties. Liquor Commissioner, Jim Marlo, stated that he would be making a decision on the hearing. At that time the liquor license was turned in on Sabrina Gavin-Smith's own accord. She stated that the decision wouldn't be necessary. Club 262 liquor license will no longer be open as of April 17, 2018.

Motion made by Jim Marlo and seconded by Brent Gentry to adjourn meeting. Roll call vote was taken as follows: Jim Marlo, Yea; Brent Gentry, Yea; Ron Ellis, Yea. All members present voting Yea; motion carried.
